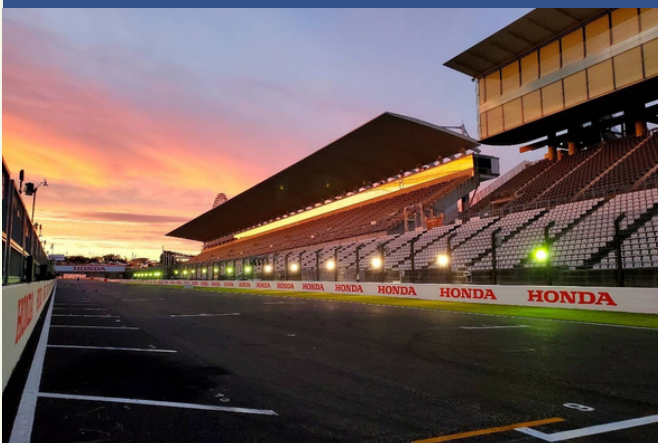

JAPANESE RESUME WRITING

THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND WHEN WORKING IN JAPAN

- To do anything in the company, you need to achieve following: "reporting, contacting, and discussing"
- Share your knowledge and resources with your coworkers so that they can look out for one another while you are on leave
- Will not exclude individuals without any experience, and they can start from scratch.
- Making mistakes during the process is acceptable, but you must learn from them and avoid making them again

ADVICES

You can work on your pronunciation in class because it will be easier for you to work in Japan. Also, you can participate in events like "Japanese tea parties" to enhance your Japanese ability. If you have time left, you can take some extra-departmental courses and add a second specialty. Working overseas is not as difficult as you might think provided you are willing to accept challenges. The most important thing is that many things need to be experienced first-hand before finding their own way.
